# A Word from the Team

The Observatoire sur la réussite en enseignement supérieur (ORES or the Observatory) is proud to present its Annual Report. This second activities report provides an overview of a busy year characterized by the deployment of a diversified service offering. Indeed, in the months following the launch of its activities in March 2023, ORES continued to grow, while strengthening its relationships with higher education institutions and key organizations related to student success.

## An Enlightening Look at Current Issues

In the fall of 2023, ORES enthusiastically launched its thematic dossier *Financial Access to Education: What are the Conditions for Student Success?* This topic, which was the backdrop of ORES' activities and publications in 2023–2024, resonated with several current concerns. ORES contributed to the discussion on cross-cutting issues by providing insights supported by research: the impact of the housing crisis and food insecurity on student success, the importance of internships compensation, financial literacy challenges faced by the student population.

In addition to financial access to education, several other aspects of student success were covered by ORES' publications and activities in 2023–2024: from student mental health to the inclusive assessment of learning, including the importance of transitions from one post-secondary level to another and the development of digital skills.

Over 70 information monitoring articles have been published and the directory of inspiring practices was enhanced by additional documentation and the promotion of several new initiatives.

In the spring of 2024, ORES also launched a new type of publication entitled *Wide Angle*. Offering a space for theoretical and critical perspectives, *Wide Angle* aims to deepen strategic thinking and to facilitate action in response to emerging challenges. The first article in the series, published with a synthesis tool designed to facilitate its appropriation, explored the commitment of higher education institutions in environmental matters.

## A Bridge Between Research and Practice

The year 2023–2024 was also an opportunity to continue the development and distribution of *Relais. The popular scientific journal on success in higher education.* Six articles proposing several courses of action were published as part of this collection, which takes a multidisciplinary look at student success. Each author has received personalized support from ORES to make their text better suited to the needs of the readership. Not only did such support allow them to consolidate their skills in science popularization, but it also facilitated the transfer of their research results to those working on the front line in educational institutions.

Always fueled by the desire to foster the creation of inter-institutional networks and to promote scientific knowledge, ORES took the past year to reflect on ways to strengthen the sharing of expertise between French-speaking and English-speaking institutions in the province of Québec. Thanks to the support of the ministère de l'Enseignement supérieur under the Canada-Québec Agreement for Minority-Language Education and Second-Language Instruction, in the upcoming months, several ORES publications will be translated and available in the English section of the website.

## Meeting with You

In the past year, in addition to completing an overhaul of its Steering Committee, which culminated with the welcoming of several new members, ORES has multiplied its meetings and collaborations: activities in partnership with key researchers or organizations, identification of possible synergies and launch of collaborative projects. These meetings inspired the team in the development of activities and content that are ever more appropriately rooted in the realities of the community.

In the winter of 2024, the Observatory also launched a survey among its target audiences to document their expectations and needs regarding information and support, as well as their appreciation of ORES' activities and publications. The results of this consultation are now informing ORES' reflections on the upcoming initiatives to be prioritized.

In conclusion, ORES is grateful to its partners and collaborators, as well as to all those committed to student success. We hope that reading this report inspires you and allows you to see all the progress made over the past year.




